



## Kraton Corporation Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

### I. Introduction

Kraton Corporation (“*Kraton*”) and each of Kraton’s wholly-owned subsidiaries (collectively, with Kraton, the “*Kraton Group*”) are committed to conducting business in an ethical and responsible manner, which includes complying with applicable slavery and human trafficking laws.

### II. Applicability of Statement

This statement applies to the Kraton Group and details the Kraton Group’s systems and controls designed to ensure that slavery and human trafficking are not present in its supply chain.

### III. Our Statement

#### A. Verification of the Supply Chain

***Conflict Minerals:*** Kraton’s Conflict Minerals Policy (available at [www.kraton.com](http://www.kraton.com)) aims to prevent human rights violations, such as modern slavery and human trafficking, from occurring by detailing the expectations for the Kraton Group and for its suppliers regarding the responsible sourcing of minerals. Where required, the Kraton Group conducts supply chain due diligence in accordance with OECD guidance, engaging suppliers who have been identified as providing the Kraton Group with materials that either contain or potentially contain Conflict Minerals. In addition, the Kraton Group has implemented provisions for new supply contracts that require suppliers to provide supply chain transparency about the source of any Conflict Minerals.

***EcoVadis and Together for Sustainability:*** The Kraton Group engages with EcoVadis, an independent global sustainability assessment specialist, to assess its supply chain. EcoVadis benchmarks our suppliers against environmental, social and ethical criteria based on a number of international standards. Once a supplier is assessed, EcoVadis provides a scorecard against the criteria. Kraton has achieved the EcoVadis Gold Rating, meaning Kraton scored in the top 5% of its industry peers in the areas of Environment, Labor & Human Rights, Ethics and Sustainable Procurement. The achievement opened the doors to Together for Sustainability (TfS), a joint initiative of chemical companies for sustainable supply chains. The initiative is based on the UN Global Compact and Responsible Care® principles. It facilitates exchanging best practices for embedding sustainability and responsible procurement in the members’ organizations, sharing data amongst TfS members and shaping the future of sustainability for the chemical industry.

***Supplier Self-Assessment Questionnaires (“SAQs”):*** As part of Kraton’s supply chain sustainability program, Kraton uses a risk-based approach in determining whether to submit detailed SAQs to certain strategic raw material suppliers. Among other areas, these SAQs
