## 6. Accidental release measures

Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Cover with plastic sheet to prevent spreading. Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal. Prevent entry into waterways, sewer, basements or confined areas. Following product recovery, flush area with water.  Small Spills: Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.  Never return spills to original containers for re-use.

## 7. Handling and storage
